Fees:

1/ fee for the Workshop and 1 st day of the 11th PMP Meeting (3 days):

In addition, we will focus on the current discussion concerning the present and future of the Belovezha Primeval Forest.

While the second day will present the cultural diversity and richness in terms of nature and ethnography occurring on the border between Eastern and Western Europe.

2.09.2017 – Saturday - trip from Torun to Belovezha

On the way to Belovezha the bus will stop in Warsaw for those participants who are not taking part in the post-conference trip

3-4.09.2017 – Sunday-Monday –two days excursion in the Belvezha National Park

5.09.2017 – Tuesday morning, after breakfast, the bus will come back to Torun via Warsaw
